Town receives offer on town center property

HOW MUCH IS THE OFFER?

\$2,300,000, the contract is available for review at the Clerk's Office

HOW MUCH DID THE TOWN PAY FOR THE PROPERTY?

The Town paid \$1,250,000 for the property in May 2000; in addition, recognized a \$100,000 discount for early payment of the original note.

WHEN WILL THE TOWN OFFICES BE RELOCATED IF THE SALE OCCURS?

The offices will move from the current location no later than June 30, 2008

WHERE WILL THE TOWN OFFICES BE LOCATED?

14740 Washington Street where the Town owns approximately 4.7 acres and is currently home to the Haymarket Police Department.

WHAT TYPE OF BUILDING WILL HOUSE THE NEW TOWN GOVERNMENT FACILITIES ?

There have been no decisions made on the future facilities. There will most likely be a temporary location for the Town Offices. A citizen's advisory committee will be formed to make recommendations on the new Town Hall.

WHAT WILL THE DEVELOPER DO WITH THE TOWN CENTER PROPERTY?

Mr. Kennedy, the developer, is proposing a renovation of the façade of the Town Hall building; restoration of the "Red Rooster", and the blue house, relocation and restoration of 4 other historically valuable homes not owned by the town and located on other parcels in the Town. Renderings of the proposed re-development are on display in the Town Hall for public view during normal business hours.
