HAYMARKET TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

SEPT. 11, 1989

All members of the Haymarket Town Council except Steven Bean was present at the Sept. 11, 1989 meeting when it began at 8 p.m. with a Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. Councilman James R. Gossom, who had been absent due to illness, was welcomed back. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved. Councilman John Kapp made a motion that the reading of the minutes be waived, seconded by Councilman Richard Bird, the motion carried. The Treasurer reported a bill to Holladay's Market of \$152.61 for gas in the Police Cruiser be paid. A motion was made by Kapp, seconded by Bird, and approved in a Roll Call Vote that the bill be paid. Mayor Terri R. Freeborn thanked Fewell and Frances Melton, Danny Kerns and others who did so much work in the yard at Town Hall.

CITIZEN'S TIME:

Glenwood Bear spoke in Citizen's Time, said he would still like to see a Flag put up in front of Town Hall. He noticed that the Fire Dept. has moved blocks over to a field. Bird told him that is the field where the Fire Dept. plans to built their new Fire Hall.

BUSINESS LICENSES:

A motion was made by Kapp to approve a business license for Dr. Loyd Frank Jarrell, DC, who will be trading as; Doctor of Chiropractic, at 6611 Jefferson St., Suite K, this is over the Haymarket Pharmacy, this was seconded by Bird and carried unanimously.

Corey L. Johnson, trading as; C.L. Johnson Woodworks, received a Business License for an office only at 6634 Hunting Path Dr. Mr. Johnson needed this to obtain a Business License from the County. Bird made the motion to approve the Business License, seconded by Kapp, the motion carried.

SPECIAL USE PERMITS:

Councilman Richard Bird made a motion to grant a Special Use Permit to Wolfe Industrial Auctions, Inc., 15 N. Court St., Frederick, Md. 21701 to hold an Auction on the property of Rex Phares at Rt. 15 & 55, on Oct. 5. A stipulation was made that they remove the trailer and trash within one week after the Auction, this was seconded Kapp, the motion carried.

Another motion was made by Bird and seconded by Kapp to approve Underwood's Concessions (Food Trailer) to sell food during the Auction Sale, the motion carried unanimously.

BUILDING PERMITS:

A Resolution from the Haymarket Planning Commission was presented concerning the application for building permit for three (3) additions and two (2) new structures at Century Stair Company. The Planning Commission found the application incomplete and not in conformance with the site plan ordinance and they recommended that the Town Council deny the request as permitted per section 6-21 of the Town Code. Bird made a motion to deny the request on the recommendations of the Planning Committee, seconded by Councilman Ronald Hancock, the motion carried.

RINGING OF BELL:

Richard Bird confirmed the fact that he would ring the bell in Town Hall on Sept. 17 for the beginning of Constitution Week.

UPDATE:

Councilman Bird gave an updated report on the Linton Hall Comprehensive Plan Amendment. Speaking on the recent meeting held at Tyler Elementary where it was recommended that an advisory committee be formed concerning the new sub-committee for the Steering Committee, Bird made a motion that Lyssa Whitfield and Fred Price be on the Sub-Committee, and Lorene Payne serve as Consultan, this was seconded by Kapp, the motion carried. Councilman Hancock made a motion that the Town Council Adopt a Resolution sayin the Town will give support to Mrs Nichols and Councilman Richard Bird on the Committee, this was seconded by Kapp, the motion carried.

LORENE PAYNE:

Lornee Payne addressed Council on the Resolution concerning the fee schedule for the Town. The Planning Commission recommended that a Public Hearing be held on this. Kapp made a motion that it be advertised 2 times in the paper and a Public Hearing be held on Oct. 2, 1989, at 7:30 p.m., this was seconded by Hancock, the motion carried. She also spoke on the Resolution concerning the Transportation section of the Comprehensive Plan. Hancock made a motion that the Planning Commission hold a Public Hearing on the Transportation Plan the 1st meeting in Dec., this was seconded by Bird, the motion carried.

MEETING CHANGE:

Kapp made a motion to change the time for the Haymarket Town Council meetings from 8 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., this was seconded by Crouch, the motion carried unanimously.

OFFICER DAMRON.

Officer Amos Damron spoke on several issues, the shooting at Everetts is legal.

He mentioned that the signs at Matthews would be up by Saturday. He also spoke on three men living in back of the old Post Office where the cleaners used to be. They are there Sunday-Thursday each week. Lorene said they could be cited with violation. Mr. Smith said a copy of the ordinance should be given to them, also Alan Gossom was to be notified. Richard Bird as Fire Chief was also going to look into this.

Bird also made a motion that the Town pay for the Physical when the new Police Officer is hired. It should cost about \$300-\$350 at Dr. Weaver's. This should include a full medical X-Ray, this was seconded by Crouch, the motion carried.

DR. WEAVER:

Dr. Weaver said that donuts and Cider would be given out on Haymarket Day in front of Robinson's Pharmacy (Haymarket Pharmacy). It would be free but a jar would be ther if anyone wanted to make a donation to the Gainesville -Haymarket Fire Dept.

YARD SALE:

Dottie Leonard said she would like to have a Yard Sale at Lane's Motors on Haymarket Day. She was notified that no yard sales should be held at Lane's since she only had a Business License for used cars not yard sales.
