HAYMARKET TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

JANUARY 14, 1991

All members of the Haymarket Town Council were present on January 14 1991 when the meeting began at 7:30 p.m. , being lead by Acting Mayor, John Kapp in a Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. Hancock made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting and that they stand approved, this was seconded by Bean, the motion carried. The Treasurer reported several bills that needed to be paid; they were

Councilwoman Dottie Leonard made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Bean, annanimously approved in a Roll Call Vote, the motion carried.

BUSINESS LICENSES:

Leonard made a motion to approve a Business License for Lyssa Whitfield, the Nature of the Business was Cleaning Service, she will be trading as; Longstreet Cleaning , the Business Address is 6611 Brave Court, this was seconded by Councilman James Shepard, the motion carried.

SITE PLANS:

It was decided to hold the Site Plans until the next meeting.

TRI-STATE:

Gary Eddy, Building Inspector, was asked to check with Tri-State Truck Center, Inc. to find out more information on the shed they are constructing to store Air Compressors and have a report to give to Council by the next meeting.

TOWN TAGS:

Councilman Ronald Hancock made a motion to order 625 Auto Tags for 1991, also 20 Motorcycle Tags and 10 Fireman Tags, colors were to be White Background with Blue Lettering, this was seconded by Leonard, the motion carried unanimously in a Roll Call Vote.

Then Leonard made a motion to reduce the amount of \$15. to \$7.50, after December 31, this was seconded by Shepard, the motion carried.

TREES:

Glenwood Bear reported that he is still working on his project "Trees".

RECYCLING:

In a letter read by Kapp from Thomas Smith on Recycling, it can not be picked up at the spot behind Matthews Restaurant, Dr. Weaver has offered another spot on his property between his office and the Post Office.

Hancock mentioned that we no longer have any Community Workers to keep the spot cleaned up, so Council will have to make arrangements. Kapp said by Spring we may have more workers.

REZONING:

A letter was read from Prince William County as a matter of curtesy regarding Lot 28, Jefferson and Jordan Lane since a small section of it is in Town, letting the Town know that they are preposing to change it from A-1 to B-1. The Town will have to do a further study on the part of it in Town .

PRINCE WILLIAM CALENDAR OF EVENTS:

Dr. Albert Weaver will let Council know if the Business and Professional Assoc. will hold a Halloween Parade this year so it can be put on the Prince William Calendar of Events.

IBM GOVERNMENT EXECUTIVE CONFERENCE:

IBM will sponsor a Government Executive Conference in Orlando Florida, April 2-4, 1991. The Conference is free but anyone attending must pay their own transportation costs.

SENIOR HOME REPAIR PROGRAM:

A program was announced that would help Senior Citizens with home repairs if they do not have the resources to pay for them. It is sponsored by the Prince William Area Agency on Aging and Open Arms, Inc. It operates with donated materials and volunteer workers.

POLICE MATTERS:

Sergeant Amos Damron reported to the Town Council that the Police Cruiser was in need of repairs and he was instructed to take it to Battlefield Ford.

Officer Damron was the only one to bid on the 1986 Reliance K Car (old Police Cruiser) so his bid for \$200 was good. Leonard made a motion to drop the insurance on the old Police Cruiser, seconded by Crouch, the motion carried. Councilman James Shepard will take care of this.

MAYORAL APPOINTMENT:

Kapp read a letter from Terri Freeborn stating she had withdrawn her appeal to the Court to be reinstated as Mayor. Then copies of a letter from Lyssa Whitfield were distributed to Council in which she once again gave support to Terri Freeborn. Steven Bean said he thought Terri Freeborn had done a good job as Mayor and made a motion that she be reinstated, this was seconded by Hancock. In a Roll Call Vote, Bean and Hancock voted for Terri; Crouch, Leonard and Shepard voted against her, Kapp abstained from voting, the motion died.

Then Dottie Leonard said she had had a number of people telephoning her at home who didn't want Terri Freeborn as Mayor, they wanted a total change. Feeling that John Kapp had done an excellent job, she made a motion to appoint him as Mayor, this was seconded by James Shepard. In a Roll Call Vote, Kapp abstained from voting, Bean voted No and Crouch, Hancock, Leonard and Shepard voted for Kapp, the motion carried.

Leonard said she would like to have a Work Session to discuss who to select to fill the Council seat left empty by Kapp. It was scheduled for Jan. 24, 7 p.m., it then would be voted on at the Regular Town Council Meeting on Feb. 4, 1991.

Glenwood Bear congratulated Kapp on his new job.

Dr. Weaver brought up the subject again about the Town having good disability insurance for Police Officers, Shepard will check on this.

Sarah Turner congratulated the new Mayor.

Kapp announced that the Planning Commission would be meeting on Jan. 15 at 7:30 p.m.
