HAYMARKET TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

MARCH 19, 1990

All members of the Haymarket Town Council were present at the March 19, 1990, Haymarket Town Council meeting when it began at 7:30 p.m., with Mayor Terri Freeborn leading the Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. Attorney James Davenport and Lorene Payne (Consultant) were also present.

Hancock made a motion not to read the minutes, seconded by Kapp, the motion carried. The minutes stood approved.

The Treasurer reported a balance in the General Account of \$70,184.62. The Treasurer also reported the following bill to be paid;

1. GOSSOM'S HARDWARE, ITEMS FOR TOWN HALL AND POLICE DEPT. \$17.72.
Councilman John Kapp made a motion to pay the bill, seconded by Councilman Richard Bird, the motion carried unanimously in a Roll Call Vote.

CITIZEN'S TIME:

In Citizen's Time, Glenwood Bear asked that everyone at the Council table speak louder as it was hard to hear them.

BROADCASTING, CHANNEL 66

James Payne, from Payne & Merchant presented some plans on the National Capital Christian Broadcasting, Channel 66. With him were several gentlemen from the Station. After explaining everything and with no further questions, Mr. Payne asked that the Site Plan be forwarded to the Planning Commission for their study and recommendations. The Town Council agreed to forward it to them.

SIGN PERMITS:

The following Sign Permits were sent to the Town Council by the Haymarket Planning Commission with their approval.

Bird made a motion to approve the Sign Permit for Bonnie & Clydes at 14951 Washington St., this was seconded by Kapp, the motion carried.

Kapp made a motion to approve the Sign Permit for Katie's Country Crafts and Farm Towys at 14950 Washington St., This was seconded by Bird, the motion carried.

Kapp made a motion to approve a Sign Permit for Pat's Country Corner at 14950 Washington St. (Office # 301), this was seconded by Bird, the motion carried.

NEW SIGN PERMIT:

A new Sign Permit for Dr. Albert Weaver, 6611 Jefferson St. was forwarded by the Haymarket Town Council to the Haymarket Planning Commission for their recommendations.

LORENE PAYNE:

Lorene Payne spoke on the amendments and additions to the Town Zoning Ordinance, telling Council if they wished to adopt them to have it put in the minutes of the meeting. Lorene, in response to Steve Woodside's letter of March 12, 1990, on objections to proposed amendments and additions to the Town's Zoning Ordinance said she will prepare a final text for adoption. Prior to reading the minutes of the April 2, 1990, meeting, Council could change this. Hancock made a motion to accept the recommendations on the amendments from the Planning Commission with modifications from Lorene and adopt them, this was seconded by Kapp, the motion carried unanimously in a Roll Call Vote.

PETITION:

Mayor Freeborn accepted Sarah Turner's Petition on the future proposed road in the Town of Haymarket.

- Amend section 4-1-21 to permit auto retail auto salvage in the B-1 district.
- Amend section 4-1-20 and 5-1-6 to permit TV and Radio stations in the B-1 and B-2 districts.
- Amend Article 8 in its entirety to revise the sign ordinance for the town of Haymarket.
