HAYMARKET TOWN COUNCIL MEETING NOVEMBER 20,1989

The Haymarket Town Council meeting began at 7;30 p.m., with a Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance, led by Mayor Terri R. Freeborn, Steven Bean was absent, also Richard Bird who was attending another meeting for the Town.

Councilman John Kapp made a motion not to read the minuets of the previous meeting since everyone had a copy, this was seconded by Councilman Ronald Hancock, the motion carried unanimously; the minuets

stood approved.

The Treasurer reported a balance in the General Account at the end of October of \$43,207.21. She also reported several bills to be paid; 1.PUBLIC OFFICIAL'S LIABILITY INSURANCE PREMIUM---\$500.00 2. GOSSOM'S HARDWARE, 2 COVERS, POLICE DEPT.-----90 Kapp made a motion to pay the bills, seconded by Hancock, the motion carried in a Roll Call Vote.
CITIZEN'S TIME:

Glenwood Bear spoke of the new Governer of Virginia. Also wished Town Attorney Turner T. Smith and his wife, a Happy 51st Anniversary.

DAVID PALMER, TOWN AND COUNTRY AUTO:

David Palmer and Mr. Jones was in in regards to the Business License for Town and Country Auto. Since Mr. Palmer had been in the hospital, Mr. Jones spoke for him. They were told they could have their Business License for a Used Car Dealership but could not have one for a Salvage Dealer and bring them into Town.Mr. Smith said that if any were brought in, they must be removed within 60 days. Police Officer Amos Damron was to be notified to check and see what was there and what needed to be gotten out in 60 days.
BUSINESS LICENSES:

Jean Lane of Lane's Motors applied for another Business License to hold Yard Sales at Lane's Motors. She said things would be kept indoors and nothing left out overnight. Kapp made a motion to grant her

the license, seconded by Crouch, the motion carried.

Cynthia Konstadinou received a Business Permit to operate Inter-National Wholesalers, this will be an office for a Wholesaler Auto Dealer, at 6707 Jefferson St., office #4. She will also need a Sign for her Business, the Sign Permit was forwarded to the Haymarket Planning Commission for their recommendations. The motion to grant the license was made by Hancock, seconded by Kapp, the motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Samuel Crouch made a motion to grant a Business License for Attai Motors, a wholesale car dealer at 6707 Jefferson St., office #6, this was seconded by Kapp, the motion carried. They also submitted a

Sign Permit, which was forwarded to the Planning Commission.



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MCCARTY'S EQUIPMENT:

Mr. McCarty from McCarty's Equipment asked for a letter from the Town

to the Dept. of Motor Wehicles stating he had approved zoning to buy, sell and display motor vehicles and trailers at his place of business, this was so he could sell utility trailers. Lorene Payne sid he must show parking spaces and the site should be viewed first. This was tabled unti it was determined how many would be parked there, etc.

discussed that McCarty did not have a sign permit for the sign he has up, this will be checked on.

RESOLUTIONS, PLANNING COMMISSION:

Lorene Payne said the Transporation Chapter of the Comprehensive plan had been adopted. By March all of the Chapters should be reviewed.

It was discussed that the 1st meeting in January be put back until MEETING DATE CHANGE: Jan. 8. Hancock made a motion to table this until the next meeting, seconded by Crouch, the motion carried.

The Planning Commission defered action until the next meeting SIGN PERMIT: on Frank's Barbecue to get location, etc. of sign.

After recommendations from the planning Commission, Kapp made a NALLS, VIRGINIA: motion to approve the storage building for Virginia Nalls, this was sec onded by Hancock, the motion carried.

Lorene Payne said the Planning Commission had turner one plans BUILDING PERMIT: for the Building Permit for Sam Crouch, for a patio and carport down since it was in violation. She recommended that the Town Council gave their denial so that Crouch could go to the Board of Zoning Appeals. Kapp made a motion to table it until the next meeting since Crouch would have to obstain from voting and that would not leave a quorum, this was seconded by Hancock, the motion carried.

Lorrene Payne announced that the surveys had been coming good. She also said that Officers of the Planning Commission needed LORENE PAYN: to have their terms of servicing estableshed, she will take care of it

Ron Hancock gave his report on the County's Comprehensive Plan COUNTY'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:
