HAYMARKET TOWN COUNCIL MEETING -- JUNE 3,1991

The regular Haymarket Town Council Meeting followed the Public Hearing at 7;30 p.m. with a Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. Hancock made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings and that they stand approved, this was seconded by Bean, the motion carried.

Reported by the Treasurer was the following bill to be paid;

1- Texaco, Gas, Police Cruiser-----\$52.43

Councilman Steven Bean made a motion to pay the bill, seconded by Councilman Ronald Hancock, unainmously approved in a Roll Call Vote. BUSINESS LICENSES:

Councilwoman Dottie Leonard made a motion to approve a Business License for

"USA Motors", an office for the Sale and Display of Motor Vehicles, including Rebuilder. This is located at 6707 Jefferson St., office #4. This was seconded by Councilman Sam Crouch, the motion carried.

Crouch made a motion to accept a Business License for E. M. Press, Inc. at 14891-B Washington St. The nature of the business would be Small Publishing and Editorial Services, provided Building Official Gary Eddy inspected it and found it alright, this was seconded by Shepard, the motion carried. Chairman of the Haymarket Planning Commission, Fred Price, said the Building Official would have to inspect it to see if it was suitable to receive an Occupancy Permit. SIGN PERMITS:

Leonard made a motion to send to the Planning Commission a Sign Permit for "USA Motors" and that it stood approved if they approved it, this was seconded by Bean, the motion carried.

SPECIAL USE PERMIT:

Leonard made a motion to approve the Special Use Permit for USA Motors, property owner being Alan Gossom, this was seconded by Bean, the motion carried. BUILDING PERMIT:

Leonard made a motion that no Building Permit was needed for the Wood Deck to be built by Jeffrey Dean, 14823 Rising Sun Lane, this was seconded by Bean, the motion carried.

FEE SCHEDULE:

Shepard made a motion to table the adoption of the new Fee Schedule until more information is received on it, this was seconded by Leonard, the motion carried. GUEST SPEAKER:

Lt. William Hunt of the Prince William County Police was the Guest Speaker. He explained the operations of the County Police in the area.

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT RESOLUTION:

Hancock made a motion to adopt the Solid Waste Management Resolution, seconded by Leonard, the motion carried. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

It was announced that a Public Hearing on the Budget for July;,1991 to June 30,

1992 would be held on June 17, 7 p.m., in Town Hall.

Mayor Kapp spoke on the Carr Property and mentioned that he was going to represent the Haymarket/Gainesville Business & Professional Association at the McCort Building, June 4, at 7;30 p.m.and he will speak against it.

The Haymarket Town Council expressed their feelings to Kapp and Leonard made a motion that Kapp should speak for all of Council, saying they were against the density, etc, this was seconded by Shepard, the motion carried. Mark Branca from the Town's Planning Commission said they should ask for reorganization of their plans.

SIDEWALKS:

In regards to the three(3) bids received for sidewalks in Town, the low bidder had forgotten some things in his bid, also all 3 forgot the Bid Bond. Leonard said that she didn't think any of the three bids should be accepted. Kapp said all the Bids would be rejected, to this Council agreeded. It was to be advertised again and Bid Packages were to be picked up by June 21 and on July 13 would be the Bid Opening. All three bidders were to be notified and reminded of the Bid Bond.

Officer Thomas Kiley reported that the Bus which was parked at Longstreet Commons

was gone. He gave him a ticket for having no Town Tag.

Glen Bear welcomed Thomas to the Town and asked him to check on speeders on

Madison St. COMPUTERS:

James Shepard spoke on Computers and has been talking with the Twinings, Mrs Twining Teaches Computers. He will give Mayor Kapp a list of items to see if his Son-In-Law can get some good prices.

Ben Ortego would like to keep his job of mowing in the Town, he would like \$20 each time he mows and an extra \$10 2 times a month for trimming. Councilman Bean was

asked to invite Ben Ortego to the next meeting to discuss this.

CITIZEN'S TIME:

Kari Paugh was welcomed to the meeting by Glenwood Bear, she is a Reporter with the Potomac News. Kapp also asked her to stand up and introduce herself.

Fewell Melton said he would like to see the corner across from Town Hall cleaned

up. Bean said it's up to the State to clean it.

Mr. Twining said he is also opposed to the Carr Property (Green Hill Farm).

Sarah Turner spoke on the Historial part of Green Hill Farm.

Kapp invited Sarah Turner to go to the meeting with Carr Properties at the McCort Building, saying he will drive her.

James Shepard mentioned he had taken a trip to several Seminars recently in relation to qualifying for grants. It's very competitive and to qualify, a big list of things must be put together.

Steven Bean said that trucks were still sitting on the old Orndoff property,

from Wolfe's Auction.

Kapp mentioned & few things for Sarah Turner and the Historic Committee. A picture of the Town of Haymarket as it is today, a neighbor of Kapp's who does still photography will do it. Also a note form a Jim O'Brien said he will take pictures and Alan Gossom will supply the film.

Dotttie Leonard said that she favored purchasing 2 log cabins and putting them together for a Museum. She hoped the Haymarket Woman's Club will take it on as a

project.
