# HAYMARKET TOWN COUNCIL MEETING-JUNE 4,1990

The Haymarket Town Council meeting began at 7;30 p.m. on June 4, 1990, with Mayor Freeborn leading the Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilman Richard Bird and James R. Gossom were absent. Councilman Kapp made a motion not to read the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Bean, the minutes stood approved. 310.98

The Treasurer reported the following bill to be paid;

Kapp made a motion to pay the bill, seconded by Bean, the motion carried.in

Fewell Melton spoke in Citizen's Time saying there are two good streets in Town but people can't walk on them because of overgrowth, CITIZEN'S TIME:

Lonnie Whitlow asked if signs for meeting be put out early in morning they are; Jefferson and Madison St.

He was notified that they are put out before 8 a.m. Sarah Turner, asked about putting signs out on Jefferson St.-Childr Playing. Bob Mayer said that perhaps the Haymarket/Gainesville Business & Professional Association will put them up if permission is received.

Kapp made a motion to approve the Resolution to Recodify an

Ordinance, this was seconded by Hancock, the motion carried. The Resolu RESOLUTION:

Hancock made a motion to petition the Court to have Dawn C. Whitl was adopted. BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS: appointed to the Board of Zoning Appeals, this was seconded by Kapp, th motion carried unanimously.

Kapp made a motion to adopt the Resolution requesting changes to BIODEGRADABLE MATERIALS: permit composting for biodegradable materials, this was seconded Hancock, approved unanimously. The Resolution was adopted June 4,1990.

Sign Permits for Dr. Lawrence Ayers and Dr. Albert Weaver were for SIGN PERMITS: warded to the Planning Commission for their recommendations.



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### BULLETS, POLICE DEPT.

Hancock asked Officer Damron to bring back to Council prices for bullets to be purchased.

#### ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Mayor Terri R. Freeborn announced that there would be Public Hearing Sin Town Hall on June 14, at 7 p.m. on; Public Hearing #1, FY 1990-91; Pablic Hearing #2, Personal Property and Real Estate Tax Rate; and Public Hearing #3, Business licences tax rate.

The Mayor also read a letter from Marika Evans in regards to paving at the Madison Corner Shoppe . She made a request of a time waiver on paving the parking area, also curbing, and promised to do so in the future.

Crouch announced that the Robinson House near the Haymarket Baptist Church had hooked up to sewerage.

### OTHER ITEMS OF MEETING:

Hancock asked if they could get Ortega to cut bushes, etc. on Jefferson and Madison St. He was told the howmowners there would have to be hotified first and told they would have to clean it off, then if they didn't take care of it, the Town could have it done and bill them.

Kapp mentioned that the County is in the process of getting the Igloos for recycling.

KAPP MADE a motion that before paving any sidewalks in Town that Vidot be contacted to the care of the asphalt on the roads first near where the sidewalks would be , this was seconded by Hancock, the motion carr

Kapp said he had had a call from an Insurance Co. (Allstate Ins. Co.) asking how Gross Receipts would affect them? He was told it would be on Commission Basis.

Mr. Smith mentioned that Personal Property taxes can be levied on Businesses in regards to machinery, etc. but equipment would have to be identified first, saying Gross Receips is a license tax.

It was decided to have Molfe Auction post bond equivalent to the cost of having someone remove trash if they didn't do it.

Steve Bean mentioned that people had come for the trailer on the Jetco property.

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Hancock made a motion to ask the County to include Haymarket in their 20 year plan, this was seconded by Kapp, the motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

At 8;32 p.m. Hancock made a motion under section 2.1-344, A6, of the Code of Virginia to go into Executive Session to discuss personnel magnitude this was seconded by Kapp, the motion carried.
