A. 6680 Fayette Street - New Building on Vacant Property

Architect Steve Wagner presents plans and material samples for the A Dog's Day Out project to be built on the vacant lot located at 6680 Fayette Street.

The Board suggests alternate style and material choices that would allow the proposed building to blend more successfully with the surrounding area of Town.

Mr. Wagner agrees to provide Ms. Smith with 2 options of updated plans, revised in accordance with the suggestions of the Board; Ms. Smith will share these plans with the Board Members, who will provide comments.

B. Payne Lane - Update

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Ms. Smith shares that Staff have met with legal representation for the Payne Lane properties. An appeal has been filed in response to the Town's Notice of Violation, which the Board of Zoning Appeals will address at its March meeting.

C. Application Updates

Ms. Smith informs the Board that she has met with an applicant who would like to demolish and develop certain properties he owns within the Town; that application is not yet complete, but she will notify the Board in due course.

Councilman Leake asks for an update on the Sheetz development.

Ms. Smith answers that Sheetz will be presenting a final site plan for the Planning Commission at its next meeting.

Councilman Leake asks whether there has been any further communication from applicants about the possible Lidl Supermarket that was interested in the Haymarket Fairgrounds.

Ms. Smith answers that there has been no further communication.

7. Town Council Updates

Councilwoman Edwards updates the Board.

There are concerns with the exterior appearance of a possible Lidl, and that it is working with a developer for a major redevelopment of the QBE Business Park. The Town Council has appointed a new Chief of Police and selected a new Clerk/Treasurer for the Town.

8. Planning Commission Updates

Councilman Leake updates the Board.

The opening of the diverging diamond interchange for I-66 and Route 15 has once again been postponed. He also shares that Officer O'Neal was struck during a traffic stop, but that he is now back to work.

9. New Business

A. Motion to Amend the Agenda

Move to amend the agenda in order to address this matter of volunteer opportunities from Battlefield High School ahead of Announcements.

Andrew Boyd, the Senior Class President of Battlefield High School, and Class Secretary Jamie Pangalinin speak to their Class' desire to establish a tradition of service, in which students give back to the Town of Haymarket.

Chair Luersen suggests an open forum with other Town bodies and the public. He ask the students what the time frame is for their project.

Councilwoman Edwards suggests that the students take on some of the preparatory projects that will be necessary to proceed with the establishment of the Haymarket Community Park.

Councilman Leake thanks the students and their class for giving back to the community. He says that two possible projects on the Harrover property would be the painting of the Well House and the dismantling of the garage on the property. The Board and Council can assemble a task list in the next few weeks, and move forward on a collaboration to complete these projects.

Chairman Luersen also brings up the Town's Earth Day, when residents come out to provide service for the Town, and suggests it as another possible day.

Councilman Edwards says that she will serve as a point of contact between the Board, the Council, and the students.

Good Evening, my name is Ethan Marsh I am a Life Scout of Troop 91 in Gainesville. My family lives in the Piedmont development in Haymarket. For my Eagle project I am planning on stenciling all of the storm drains in Haymarket with this stencil. The project will be no cost to the town; the funds to pay for the stencils, paint, and supplies will come from my scout account, held by Troop 91 with funds that I have raised through mulch sales over the years. Scouts can spend this money on Eagle projects if they choose to. If approved by your Board, the project will be scheduled for a Sat/Sun in the springtime, on a day with no rain in the forecast. We will work in teams of 4-5 persons – all boy scouts with at least one adult assigned to each group. First, we will sanitize the area, lay the stencil, hold it in place, and roll the paint over the stencil, then carefully lift the stencil up from the pavement, and allow for drying. The adult will be the designated painter for each group. It will take us one day to complete the project. We have not chosen a paint color yet, but white is the most common. Also, I have not contacted any of the home owner associations within Haymarket for their approval. Thank you for your time. Are there any questions?
