Public Hearing issue amendment

Councilwoman Bailey recommends council exclude apartments from I-1 district use. The PC does not think it is a proper mix to have apartments in the I-1 district.

Atty Arledge states he would think it would not be included since it is not retail sales or office use.

Councilwoman Bailey excludes (page 725) nursery school, child care center, and kindergarten. Councilwoman Stutz states she disagrees as some shopping centers have child care. Councilman Mohr says that area is changing now – the adjoining area will change too.

Mayor Kapp agrees because of the enhancement Mr. Leaberry has put in. Councilwoman Stutz states anything you can do to enhance that district would be good. Councilman Mohr asks if we can put that as a special use. Atty Arledge states you can. Councilwoman Stutz suggests all uses other than retail or office use would be by special use permit.
