Police Report

Sgt. Roop reported (see attached.)

Councilman Mohr asks if the stolen property is found can it be reclaimed. Sgt. Roop states the officer that finds the property reports to the reporting officer (felony property) and the reporting officer contacts the owner of the property.

School Bus Transportation Center

Meeting at the Board of Supervisors July 11, 7:30 p.m. at McCoart Building. Mayor Kapp states the supervisors have never had this sort of issue come before them. The supervisors may hold a public hearing or they may decide on July 11 or they may decide not to hear the issue. Mayor Kapp would like as many folks that can come to the meeting. They may have a citizen's time each person that signs up may speak for three minutes. The Board may table this issue.

Historical Commission

Chairwoman Masterson states there was not a meeting this month. Groundbreaking ceremony held today. Street should be done in two to three months. Council needs to look at money for ISTEA and Town Center Property expenses. Councilman Mohr thinks Council should get AOL involved to sponsor ISTEA.

Web Site

Councilman Mhr to write a letter for former Councilman Jasionowski to release the web site.

Town Center Property

Mayor Kapp ordered carpet and treads. We need fire proof doors. Lowe's will give town contractors status for supplies.

Municipal Code

Recommendations from Atty Arledge were submitted for viscous dog modeled after state code.

Containment must be chain link 2' underground. Need fence requirements, regulations.

School Transportation Center

Board of Supervisors turned down the bus parking lot at Tyler. Councilman Mohr says he learned a big lesson dealing with PWC. He states we should have gone with input from the staff. The Board of Supervisors looked to their staff for recommendations.

Pace West

Mayor Kapp talked to the Building Official. The school is adding trailers to Pace West. Eric Mays at the County said the School Board should be going to the town for permits, etc. The School Board is planning more activity at Pace West. Mayor Kapp will talk to Eitler.

Street Light Wreaths

Street lights will be up by Christmas. Mayor Kapp suggests we get four foot wreaths to go around lights. We need twenty seven of them (from Fayette to Madison Street.)

Bricks

Mayor Kapp states we are ready to order the bricks.

Auction July 8

Mayor Kapp reports the town made \$3500 from the auction and \$274 in donations and food sales. Mayor Kapp did not know Bolton was charging us 25% or an additional 10% buyers premium. Mayor Kapp will pursue with Mr. Bolton who had an accident and wasn't able to be there.

Haymarket Day

Mayor Kapp will assign tasks to each Council member for a committee.

Shoppes at Haymarket

Mr. Leaberry wants approval of construction permit subject to Lowery approval. Mr. Leaberry's loan commitment is to July 31. Mayor Kapp does not see why Council can't approve contingent to Building Official approval.

Councilman Mohr says that is a huge plan, would not know whether to approve. PC & ARB have approved the plan.

Mayor Kapp says performance bond needs to be addressed. Mr. Leaberry says bond is part of the loan package. Councilman Mohr says we just agreed we aren't giving approval contingent on something. Councilman Mohr moved to approve building plans for Shoppes at Haymarket contingent on approval of building official, second by Councilwoman Bailey. Councilwoman Stutz asked to include fees to review, bonds and other fees. Councilman Mohr amended his

motion to include review, bond and other fees due prior to approval, second by Counilwoman Bailey. Yeas: Mohr, Bailey, Scarbrough, Shepard, Utz. Nays: None. Abstain: Stutz. Motion carried by 5/0/1 vote.

Haymarket Self Storage - revision of front elevation

Mr. Minchik and Mr. Jacobson requested Council's approval of a conceptual plan to scale down the Washington Street frontage of the facility due to the Food Lion screening it from view. They request the opportunity to re-do the front by removing the two story and put something on the Century Stair side that will be visible. Councilman Utz states it makes good sense to re-think and do something tasteful but not extravagant. The office will be on the Northwest corner. Their engineers are checking calculations on the storm water management pond for possible fill in a portion of the pond. They will apply in the next cycle for thirty parking spaces on that space if approved.

Comprehensive Plan Survey

PC submitted for approval. Atty Arledge states the state code changed and cited the new code. Tabled to August 7 meeting.

Council meeting agenda

Councilwoman Bailey requests the packets be ready Friday prior to Monday meeting. Clerk asked for support that anything submitted after the submission date will not be included on the agenda. Council fully supports this action.

Councilwoman Scarbrough moved to appoint Bill Goodwin to the Planning Commission for a full four year term, second by Councilman Utz. Yeas: Mohr, Bailey, Scarbrough, Shepard, Utz, Stutz. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Motion carried by 6/0/0 vote.

Architectural Review Board - Mayor Kapp suggested Shirley Kapp for the vacancy. Councilwoman Bailey moved to appoint Shirley Kapp to vacant seat, term expires December 9, 2002, second by Councilwoman Scarbrough. Yeas: Mohr, Bailey, Scarbrough, Shepard, Utz, Stutz. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Motion carried by 6/0/0 vote.

Ordinance Amendment to permit non-resident professionals to serve on Planning Commission & ARB - Atty Arledge to revise ordinance.

<u>Historical Foundation Liaison</u> - Councilwoman Stutz states she is interested in this position. Mayor Kapp told Councilman Mohr to take to Historical Commission getting corporate sponsors for the museum. Mayor Kapp is going to put his focus and energy on the town center property rather than the museum fund raising. Councilman Mohr suggests Councilwoman Stutz be on the Heritage Committee of the Historical Commission.

Plaque for street scape

Councilman Mohr asked Council to design a plaque to credit Mayor Kapp for his effort in bringing the street scape to fruition. Council agrees that would be a good idea. Councilman Mohr moved to approve commemorative plaque for Mayor Kapp for street scape work, second by Councilwoman Stutz. Councilman Mohr will serve as chairman of the committee. Yeas:

Wreaths for street lights

Councilwoman Stutz will check wholesale price for the wreaths. Councilwoman Scarbrough to bring it up at the next ARB meeting. Tabled.

Time Clock

Councilman Utz states he had some information he will present for August 7 meeting.

PD Radar

Councilman Mohr asked when we will see the radar time. Sgt. Roop told Councilman Utz that no one speeds through here. Councilman Utz asked Sgt. Roop for a log when they run radar for submission to Council. Councilman Utz will have for next meeting. Councilman Mohr asked about hand held radar. Councilman Utz will respond at the next meeting.

PD badges

Mayor Kapp states he got information on the Internet that Haymarket Police Dept badges are for sale on e-bay. Mayor Kapp went to closed auctions and found it was in Oklahoma. They were Haymarket Va. Badges for \$17.99. He will continue to investigate.

Town Center Property

Councilman Utz states that must be our #1 priority. If we have to give the museum money back because we can't match the funds so be it. He doesn't want to sacrafice the new offices for the museums sake. He thinks there is a lot on Council's plate.

Councilwoman Scarbrough has contacted her gym owner who is interested in 1200 square feet of space. Councilwoman Stutz asked who is doing what and what is the plan of renovation, renovation plan design? Mayor Kapp wants to adjourn to the town center for input.

Council business

Councilwoman Bailey asked about having someone here on Monday night, once a month, to represent Council to answer citizen concerns. No one thought it necessary. No one wanted their personal addresses on the web site, e-mail and phone numbers only.

Walter Robinson Lane property

Marie Gray owns 5.9 acres in town. They asked if the town would be interested in buying the property for a park. Mayor Kapp says he asked Mr. Ayers to sell his lot to the town. Mr. Ayers wants to hold onto it for his retirement but will give the town the first right of refusal.

Mayor Kapp says they (Gray) are getting an appraisal on the property right now. Mayor Kapp expects it to be \$200,000. They had an offer for \$220,000. Councilman Utz would rather have the town buy it for a park than anything else.

Town Clerk questions

Town Clerk asked what the town is funding for the town clerk's health insurance. The budgeted amount for FY '01 is \$3,000. Last year's budget was \$3100 and the clerk's request was to go on the town's insurance which would be \$3600. Councilman Mohr moved to increase the insurance benefit for the Town Clerk to \$3600 from \$3000 to acquisition increase from the

general fund contingency account, second by Councilman Utz. Yeas: Mohr, Bailey, Scarbrough, Shepard, Utz, Stutz. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Motion carried by 6/0/0 vote.

Town Clerk asked Council if she could reimburse the town's general fund for the purchase of the popcorn machine from the Historical Foundation account. The Clerk was informed to do so.
