

All members of the Haymarket Town Council were present at the Dec. 21,1987 Haymarket Town Council Meeting when it began at 8 p.m. with a Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Gertrude Bean. Minutes of the November meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$40,118.40 in the General Account and \$95.67 in Revenue Sharing at the end of November, Councilman Utz made a motion to pay the bills;

- 1. Haymarket Service Center(work on Police Cruiser)-----\$333.67
- 2. Manassas Car Wash(Police Cruiser)-----\$ 4.75
- 3. Wilmer Hutchinson(Fire Insurance, Town Hall)-----\$374.00
- 4. Haymarket Grocery(Cleaning Supplies, Town Hall)-----\$9.97
- 5. Holladay's Market(Gas, Police Cruiser)-----\$109.56
- 6. Gossom's Hardware(Items, Police Dept.)-----\$ 12.36

This was seconded by Councilman Richard Bird and unanimously approved in a roll call vote.

BUSINESS LICENSES:

Three Business Licenses were granted;

- 1. Sam Crouch made a motion to grant Jim Cook one to sell fruit at Holladay's Market, this was seconded by Councilwoman Freeborn and unanimously approved.
- 2. Richard Bird made a motion to grant Robert A. Mayer, Jr. CPA Trading as Johnson and Scarborough, CPA'S, to be located behind Mathew's Restaurtant, a Business License, seconded by Freeborn and unanimously approved.
- 3. Freeborn made a motion to grant Gregory Hartle a Business License to operate a Sandwich Shop at 14951 Washington St.(Old Bank Building), this was seconded by Bird and unanimously approved.

BUILDING PERMITS

In a letter from Chairman William Green of the Planning Commission, who couldn't be present, he mentioned that on one place of Dr. Weaver's plans for his new Building, it was about two and a half feet too high but it would be lowered.

Robert and Lisa Royal, 6795 Jefferson St. was granted a permit to enclose the one side of their two car garage to make a family room. Bird made the motion which was seconded by Utz and approved.

DAVID TINKHAM

David Tinkham appeared before Council and siad he would put up a Bond for the completion of the street in Longstreet Commons for \$102,000. and another Bond for the Soil and Erosion Control in the development for \$5,000. Bird made a motion to accept both Bonds, the Bond for \$5,000. be dropped at completion if everything was all right and the Bond for \$102,000. be dropped when the street was accepted into the Highway System, this was seconded by Melton and unanimously approved.

FEE, REVIEWING PLANS

Councilman Richard Bird made a motion that the fee of \$125.(One Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars) be charged for Reviewing Plans submitted, this was seconded by Councilwoman Freeborn and approved.

NOT APPROVED, PLANNING COMMISSIONER.

William Green had asked to be appointed Planning Commissioner instead of Chairman of the Planning Commission but this was not approved. Several Council Members mentioned that they preferred the Plans to come directly to Town Hall so they could be put on record.

TOWNHOUSES:

Joe Roberts gave a brief talk and showed plans concerning a group of Townhouses he wanted to see go up on the Bolt property on Bleight Dr. In order to do this the property would have to be rezoned. The amount of

Townhouses he was proposing was 93 Townhouses. Mr. Roberts mentioned that they would bring water to the project from Catharpin Rd. Also they would like to put a Day Care Center on the property. Attorney Smith mentioned there would have to be two Public Hearing held on the Rezoning. In a note from the Planning Commission, their answer was no. to the request. John Reid who was present explained how they had reached this decision.

MAYOR BEAN

Mayor Bean mentioned that William Green would submit information as to the cost, etc. of Building Bookshelves in Town Hall and a new Council Table at the January, 1988 Town Council Meeting.

COUNCIL MEMBERS, OTHERS:

Bird asked that a Resolution be sent to the County, Director of Mapping, asking that after Platts have been approved to provide street names and addresses.

Bird also made a motion that the new group proposing to buy Tinkhams' put eight Fire Hydrants in the development and paint them red. This would let the Fire Dept. know the quantity of water in each one. This was seconded by Freeborn and approved.

Bird also thanked the Activities Committee for the Christmas program they held in Town which was a big success.

John Reid asked if the Town has adopted a Noise Ordinance and Bird replied, there is a little something on it now but a lot more will be included in the new Codification of Ordinances.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

At 9:20 p.m., Bird made a motion under Section 2.1-344 of the Code of Virginia to go into Executive Session to discuss Personnel Matters, this was approve.

REGULAR SESSION:

At 9:55 p.m., Bird made a motion to go back into Regular Session, seconded by Utz and approved. In regular session Bird made a motion to buy Officer Damron a new coat and hat, seconded by Utz and approved in a roll call vote.

ADJOURNMENT:

WITH no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:57 p.m.
