

HAYMARKET TOWN COUNCIL MEETINGDECEMBER 16, 1985

A very short Haymarket Town Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor Gertrude Bean on Dec. 16, 1985, with a Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. Councilman Richard Bird was absent. Minutes of the Nov. meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$11,944.80 in the General Account and \$726.33 in Revenue Sharing at the end of Nov. Councilman Sam Crouch made a motion that a bill be paid in the amount of \$153. to Loudoun Mutual for Fire Insurance on Town Hall which would be due on Jan. 1, 1986, this was seconded by Councilman Utz and in a roll call vote was unanimously approved.

SIMPSON'S TRUCKING CO.

It was reported by the Mayor that a formal letter had been sent to the Simpson Brothers by certified mail asking them to remove the campers from Orndoff's Property by Dec. 20, 1985, and to clean up the area. Attorney Smith mentioned if they did not comply with this, a summons or warrant could be issued to them citing the violation.

PROTECTIVE SERVICES

Mayor Bean read a letter from Protective Services and they have decided that since there were some objections raised at the Nov. Meeting, nothing further would be presented to the Town Council at this time.

APARTMENTS

The Town Clerk read a letter from Town Attorney, Turner Smith, stating that a builder is proposing to construct apartments within the Town, but the present ordinance does not allow it. He felt that there should be a consideration of the inclusion of apartments as being a permitted use in some zoning district of the Town. Mr. Smith recommended a hearing on this before both the Planning Commission and the Town Council be held after the appropriate advertising as required.

COUNCIL MEMBERS

Councilman Melton asked if Trash Collectors in the Town have to be bonded and Mr. Smith informed him that they do not.

CABLE T. V.

Mr. Smith informed Don White on behalf of Telesat Cable T. V. that Cable T. V. cannot be licensed and no cable system can go into a district without a Franchise. He further went on to answer other questions Mr. White had, such as the companies should turn in sealed bids, etc.

BUSINESS LICENSE

A business license was granted to Janes J. and Lois J. Jordan to open a office on Orndoff's property to be known as J. & L. Cable Services, Inc. & J. & L. Engineering. The motion was made by Councilman Crouch and seconded by Councilman Melton, unanimously approved.

ADJOURNMENT

At 8:35 p.m., Terri Freeborn made a motion to adjourn the Dec. meeting, seconded by Sam Crouch.
