

MAY 20, 1985

On May 20, 1985, Mayor Gertrude Bean called the Haymarket Town Council meeting to order. The roll call found all members of Council present with the exception of Councilman James Gossom. After the prayer and Pledge of Allegiance, minutes of the April meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer reported a balance of \$8,905.22 in the General Account and \$834.52 in Revenue Sharing at the end of April. The check in the amount of \$8,905.22 from the Prince William Service Authority for sewer taps was discussed. There was a question as to the \$1200 reimbursement per tap, is it correct? Attorney Turner Smith was going to check on this. In the meantime Mr. Smith suggested depositing the check and drawing interest on it.

Mayor Bean read several letters. One was from the Prince William County Library stating that construction funds for a Haymarket/Gainesville mini library have been provided by the County Board of Supervisors, however they do not have a site in the area as yet. The other letter was from Prince William County in regards to considering a county-wide tax administered by the County, the revenues from which could be shared with the Town.

Police Chief Donn Fasick gave a report on Lane's Autos. They will have a crusher come in within several weeks to take care of some of them.

Councilman Sam Crouch talked about Clean Up Day in the Town. He said the type of trash should be narrowed down in the future as the Highway Dept. will not pick up large objects and only did so this year since Richard Bird provided them with a place to dump it. Anne Smith who was present at the meeting apologized for the large pile.



Edward Bailey appeared before Council and said he would like to get the situation settled on his house in Madison Acres. Mr. Smith informed him that it was between him and the builder and not the Town. He suggested that he talk with the Town's Building Inspector who was present, so both gentlemen, Mr. Bailey and Mr. Berger went outside to discuss it, after which Attorney Baker, the builder, Jim Brown's Lawyer, told Council that Mr. Brown is willing to work with Mr. Bailey and the Haymarket Town Council to get things straightened out.

With no further business, the May meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
