

The Nov. 19, 1984, HAYMARKET Town Council Meeting began with a prayer and Pledge of Allegiance. All members were present with the exception of Mr. Gossom.

Minutes of the October meeting were read and approved. The Treasurer reported a balance of 550.77 in the General Account and \$918.06 in Revenue Sharing at the end of November. In a roll call vote, Council voted unanimously to pay CLO Printing \$123.73 for envelopes and forms for the Building Inspector. Two other roll call votes were taken and unanimously approved; they were; 1. to purchase the phone in Town Hall and 2. to make a contribution to the Gainesville-Haymarket Fire Dept. in memory of Mr. Orndoff.

A letter was read from Attorney Smith stating that according to a recent amendment becoming effective Jan. 1, 1985 would permit a member of Council to be named to fill the position of Mayor. Gertrude Bean, Vice Mayor shall in the meantime continue acting as Mayor until the Town Council appoints a new mayor or a new Mayor is elected. A new Council member where there is a vacancy to be filled, shall be done by the Council by the appointment of any one eligible to such office.

Other items discussed at the November meeting were; Macon Piercy received permission to remodel the inside of a house on Muriel Gilbertson's property. No building permit is needed. Councilman Bird made the motion on this, seconded by Councilman Melton and approved.

\* Jim Abercrombie received a business license to operate a tire service and road service on Jordan Lane. He would also like to put up a sign, but is to get additional information on it as to size, etc. Mr. Bird made the motion to grant them both, seconded by Councilman Crouch and approved. Attorney Smith suggested that the issue of the sign should go to the Board of Zoning Appeals.

\*Councilwoman Crewdson asked that Council have a work session to go over the ordinances. Councilman Fewell Melton suggested Dec. 3, at 7 p.m., which was agreed upon.

\*She also asked to invite Mr. Proctor, the Building Inspector from Richmond to the Jan. Haymarket Town Council Meeting to address Council. A letter was to be sent to him to see if it was convenient.

\*Mr. Bird made a motion that a sign be made to duplicate the old sign that was over Town Hall Door., to be made by David Freeborn, at a cost of \$100. Materials to be used are; MDO plywood framed in pine, to be delivered one week from date of order and payment will be due upon delivery of sign. This was seconded by Mr. Crouch and unanimously approved.

\* Dennis Wrye reported that the proceeds from Haymarket Day were; \$568.81 with still about \$80 more to come in from advertisement in books. At the present time plans are being made for Christmas. There is to be a Christmas event at Town Hall Parking lot on Dec. 15, 3-5 p.m. The Committee will need \$300 for this, plus \$100 for a donation to the Band that played on Haymarket Day. It was suggested that the \$400 be taken out

OF THE check first and the rest given to be deposited to the Picnic Fund. After a lengthy discussion, Councilman Melton made a motion that the Committee come back to the January meeting and be appointed and recognized as a Town Committee for various activities of the Town and present their plans, the motion was seconded by Councilwoman Crewdson and approved.

\*Councilman Crouch made a motion not to hold a Council meeting in December, seconded by Crewdson and approved.

At 9:11 p.m., Mrs Crewdson made a motion under section 2.1-344 of the code of Va. to go into Executive Session to discuss personnel matters, seconded by Mr. Bird and approved.

At 9:35 p.m., Mr. Melton made a motion to go back into regular session, seconded by Councilman Bird and approved.

In regular session, Police Fasick was granted permission to work on Rt. # 66 for several hours a day. The contract Fasick asked for will be discussed at the January meeting.

Before the meeting adjourned, Mr. Melton asked about the delinquent taxes in Town and suggested giving a written notice that they must be paid in 10 days or legal action would be taken.

With no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:40 p.m.
