

MAY 16, 1983

The May 16, 1983 Haymarket Town Council meeting began at 8 p.m. with five members of Council present. Councilman James Gossom was unable to attend. After the prayer and pledge of allegiance, minutes of the April meeting were read and approved. Treasurer Gertrude Bean reported a balance of \$19, 900.22 in the General Account and \$1, 335.60 in Revenue Sharing at the end of April.

The problem of tractor-trailer trucks being parked on the Paxton property was discussed. Town Attorney Turner Smith told Council if the trucks are parked on an owner's property zoned business, they could not be made to move them, however if they are housed in Town on a regular basis, perhaps taxes can be collected. Dennis Wyre was asked to do a further check on them/

In new business, Lisa Bailey appeared before Council asking for a raise of from \$15 to \$20 a week for her yard work at Town Hall. Councilman Sam Crouch made a motion that her salary be raised, seconded by Councilman Hugh Orndoff and approved.

Dennis Wyre asked if the Town would sponsor the Town picnic on July 16, from noon to 5 p.m. at the Gainesville School. This would mean paying the insurance for the day. Councilwoman Bean made a motion that this be done, seconded by Anne Smith and approved.

Mr. Orndoff received a building permit for a 12x 20 extension to the body shop on his property. This was voted on and approved.

A letter of Resignation was read from Officer Beryl Cline. Councilwoman Anne Smith made a motion that it be accepted with regret. Crewdson seconded it and it was approved.

At this point, Anne Smith made a motion at 8:50 p.m. to go into Executive Session under Section 2.1-344 of the Code of Virginia. Then at 9:15 p.m. Miss Smith made a motion that they go back into regular session, both of these actions were seconded by Mrs Crewdson.

In regular session, it was announced that Don Fasick would remain with the Police Dept. and no other police officer would be hired. This was to be on a trial basis for awhile.

With no further business, the May meeting adjourned at 9:20 p.m.
