Joe Geris, Jr. received a building permit to build a rambler at 14760 Jordan Lane. Anne Smith made the motion and Gertrude Bean seconded it, unanimously approved.

Precision Manufacturing Co. needs a letter approving the construction of their new building. Councilwoman Smith made a motion athat it be sent, seconded by Councilwoman Bean and unanimously approved.

Turner Smith made a suggestion that if any building is to be put up in the flood area of Haymarket, that the ordinance pertaining to it be read over.
