

The August 16, 1982 Town Council meeting which began at 8 p.m. found all members of Council present with the exception of Hugh Orndoff who was reported ill. Town Attorney Turner Smith was also present. Mayor Muriel Gilbertson led the prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of the July meeting were read and approved. Treasurer Gertrude Bean reported a balance of \$13,558.24 in the General Account and \$739.70 in Revenue Sharing at the end of July. Councilman James Gossom has had the money in the checking account put on a plan similar to SCAT.

The Mayor reported that she has had no complaints about the sewer line being put in Haymarket as far as noise, dust, etc.

First on the agenda was the subject of replacing the locks on two doors at Town Hall since they are very old and it is difficult to purchase keys to fit them. Councilwoman Bean made a motion to do it, seconded by Councilman Sam Crouch and unanimously approved.

In Police business, Officers Don Fasick and Beryle Cline are in need of new uniforms. In a motion made by Councilman Gossom, seconded by Councilwoman Anne Smith and approved by the rest of Council, the officers will receive two short sleeved shirts, two long sleeved shirts and two pair of pants each, plus some patches.

The Police also mentioned that they need health and medical insurance and offered two plans for this, 1. if their salaries were raised to \$6 per hour, they would purchase their own insurance or 2. the Town could take out the insurance. Both plans were turned down as at this time the Council didn't find it feasible.

At the conclusion of the meeting John Bonfadini who is a candidate for the House of Delegates introduced his self and said that he had enjoyed the meeting and hearing Government being conducted on a Town level.

With no further business, the August meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
