The July 19,1982, Haymarket meeting began at 8.05 p.m., with a prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance. All members of Council were present, also Turner Smith, Fewell Melton and Elmer Ray.

Minutes of the June meeting were read and approved. Treasurer Gertrude Bean reported a balance of \$14,780.25 in the General Account and \$551.70 in Revenue Sharing at the end of June. In addition to the Treasurer's report, she gave Council members also a copy of the Income and Expenses for the Fiscal year of July, 1981 thru June, 1982. Mrs Bean mentioned that she had not been able to get to the Bank to inquire about putting the money in the General Account into SCAT or somthing similiar. Councilman James Gossom offered to take care of this for her.

Elmer Ray applied to Council for a permit to establish a used car dealership at 14900 Washington St. Councilman Hugh Orndoff made a motion to grant it, 2nd by Councilwoman Bean and approved by 5 Council members, with Councilwoman Lois Crewdson voting against it.

Mayor Muriel Gilbertson informed Council that she had received a call from a town resident (whose name had been misplaced) asking permission to keep chickens on her property. The Council had no objections to this.

Next the Mayor read a letter from James May and Associates asking for a "Procurement of Supplies Resolution" for HUD, At the present time

Mrs Gilbertson needs a 2 drawer file cabinet to keep files and papers in that pertain to the sewerage project in Town. Councilwoman Anne Smith made a motion for the resolution, 2nd by Councilwoman Crewdson and unanimously approved.

The sewerage connection at Town Hall was discussed but more information is needed on this.

With nor further business, the meeting adjourned at 9;56 p.m.
