

The March 15th, 1982, meeting of the Haymarket Town Council began promptly at 8 p.m. with Mayor Muriel Gilbertson leading with a prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance. All members were present with the exception of Lois Crewdson.

Minutes of the February meeting were read and approved with a minor change requested by Councilwoman Anne Smith.

In Treasurer Gertrude Bean's report, there was a balance of \$11,656.46 in the General Account and \$175.70 in Revenue Sharing at the end of February. The Mayor notified Mrs Bean that the fee for the Municiple League would be going up 5% in June which would make the charge \$125 a year.

There were several visitors and area residents present for the meeting, they were; Pierre and Lou Bernard, Fewell Melton, Mr. Nowatny from Gainesville and Mr. Arundez from the radio station. Beryl Cline and Town Attorney Turner Smith were also present.

Councilwoman Bean reported a light out about the middle of Payne Drice which the Mayor said she would report to the Electric Company.

Councilman Sam Crouch reported that he had fixed the large pothole at the entrance to Town Hall. Mrs Gilbertson asked him to take care of several others in the parking lot at Town Hall.

Councilwoman Smith asked Officer Cline what progress the Police Dept. was making on the checking of dogs rabies shots in Town? He repoied that about 30% of the homes had been contacted and most all had had their shots. The Police Dept. planned to complete the inquiry within the

week.

Mr. Willard Allison would be selling Town tags in Town Hall from March 15- April 15.

The Mayor informed Council that the Zoning Ordinance should be ready for approval by the April meeting. She also mentioned that the Segament and Erosion Control Ordinance will have to be updated.

Sam Crouch was asked to call the Highway Dept. and report traffic signs in Town that had been knocked down.

With no further business, the Mayor adjourned the March meeting at 8:35 p.m.
