

A SPECIAL MEETING WAS HELD ON March 1, 1982, in the Haymarket Town Hall at 8 p.m. to discuss different possibilities of ways to pay the Town's share of the sewerage costs.

Five members of Council were present to make up the quorum, they were; Gertrude Bean, Sam Crouch, James Gossom, Hugh Orndoff and Anne Smith.

A letter was read by Mayor Muriel Gilbertson from Ernest Hooker of the Bank of Virginia stating his views on how the money could be borrowed.

Then another plan was discussed by a representative of Piedmont Federal Savings and Loan Association, Mr. Pete Hamlett who was present at the meeting. In a motion made by Councilman James Gossom, seconded by Councilwoman Anne Smith and unanimously approved by Council, it was decided to renew the Certificate Deposits with Piedmont Federal Savings and Loan Association as this seemed to be the best way to obtain the money for the Town's share of the sewerage cost.

Mayor Muriel Gilbertson read a letter from GMSD and all members of Council were in agreement that they wished GMSD to proceed under the conditions of the agreement with the Town's share of the construction cost for facilities within the Town equal to \$36,300.

With no further business, the short meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
