THE Haymarket Town Council Meeting began on Aug. 17, at 8 p.m. with a Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Muriel Gilbertson.

Five Council members made up the quorum, Councilman Hugh Orndoff was not present.

Minutes of the July meeting were read by the Clerk and approved. Treasurer Gertrude Bean reported a balance of \$20, I99. I5 in the General Account and \$355.7I in Revenue Sharing at the end of July. In addition to the Treasurer's report, Mrs Bean also presented to the Haymarket Town Council a copy of the Income and Expenses for the year beginning July I, I980- June 30, I98I.

In committee reports, Councilwoman Ann Smith, Health and Safety, reported holes in the road on Madison St. She also told Council that the sign on Jefferson St. which had been too close to the Road had been removed. The 4R's Work Shop in the old Post Office Building was not causing any traffic problems.

The Ordinance for the Franchise by the Continental Telephone Co. had been corrected and was read by the Mayor to the Council. Council-woman Gertrude Bean made a motion that it be accepted, 2nd by Council-woman Smith and unanimously approved. It is now to be advertised once a week for four successive weeks in some newspaper of general circulation in the Town, and by such advertisment, invite bids for the privileges and rights proposed to be guided by such ordinance, which bids shall be in writing and shall be delivered to the presiding officer of the Council of the Town in open session at the Sept. 2I meeting. Expense of the advertisment shall be paid by the Continental Telephone Co.

Lue and Pierre Berard requested a resolution from the Haymarket
Town Council to approve the submission of an application for an
Industrial Development Bond to be used for I. A Baskin-Robbins Ice
Cream Store to be located in the building currently housing the Tack
Shop. 2. For the completion of renovations at Jordan and Jordan
General Store into a General Energy Center. 3. For the restoration
of the building known as "The Old Homestead" for use as professional
office space. 4. For the reconstruction of the stone warehouse into
a Haymarket Inn Restaurant, in keeping with the decor of the original
Haymarket Inn. Mrs Bean made a motion that permission of an application for an Industrial Development Bond be given to the Berard's,
seconded by Miss Smith and approved by the rest of the Council with
the exception of Councilwoman Lois Crewdson who abstained from voting.

The Annandale Millwork Corp. would like to enlarge their facility in Haymarket. They asked a resolution of the Council concurring in the adoption of an Inducement Resolution by the Industrial Development Authority of the County of Prince William to take Effect immediately. Councilwoman Smith made a motion that it be adopted and Councilman James Gossom 2nd it, approved by the rest of the Council.

In other business conducted at the August Town Council meeting;

*Ann Smith reported on the Library meeting she had attended as a representative of the Haymarket Town Council.*Dennis Wyre, Chairman of the Planning Commission asked that a "Public Hearing" be held on the proposed Subdivision Ordinance. Mrs Crewdson made a motion that the Public Hearing be held on Sept. 2I, 7;30 p.m., prior to the regular Town Council meeting at 8 p.m. which was approved. It will be advertized in a local newspaper a week before. * Mayor Gilbertson

read a letter from Ellen Wilson asking that the Town of Haymarket sponsor the Haymarket picnic again this year to be held at the Gainesville Elementary School on Sept. I2, from noon to 5 p.m. Gertrude Bean made a motion which was carried that the Town sponsor it and pay the \$100 insurance fee that is necessary for the day. *Mary Holladay, the new owner of Holladay's Market, located at I5520 John Marshall Highway, across from Orndoff's Service Station, attended the meeting to learn more about the Town.

The August meeting adjourned at 9; I7 p.m.
