

A special called meeting of the Haymarket Town Council was brought to order at 8:00p.m. on May 5, 1980. Mrs. Gilbertson opened with prayer and the Pledge. All Council members were present except Mr. Gossom. Members of the Planning Commission and the Citizen Participation Committee were also in attendance. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the public hearing concerning the Gainesville-Haymarket sewer project.

The first matter of business was to discuss the Court. With the death of Judge Arthur Stickley last Saturday, the Town Court is no longer in existence. Mrs. Linda Setteth, the Court Administrator for Prince William County, will assist in the transfer of cases. Mr. Bendel will be court Prosecutor for the Town of Haymarket. Mr. Jordan asked if Prince William County police will have joint jurisdiction with Town officers. Judge Frank Murphy will assist with the transition.

The next matter brought before the Council was the public hearing on May 15 at 9:00a.m. at the Executive Motel in Richmond. Mrs. Gilbertson informed Council members and guests that the purpose of the hearing before the State Water Control Board was to protest the removal of the Gainesville-Haymarket sewer project from the 1981 priority list. This move will put our HUD funding in jeopardy and it is doubtful that this process would be repeated in 1985 or beyond.

Mr. Jordan stressed the importance of informing speakers for the Town of the history and documentation of the health hazard which exists.

Mr. Orndoff mentioned the amount of money that has been spent on previous planning and engineering as well as the surveying and engineering which is being completed now.

Plans were made to contact additional people to go to Richmond and meet at the Town Hallon Thursday, May 15 at 6:45a.m.

Another meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 13 at 8:00p.m. in the Town Hall to coordinate ideas and speakers.

Being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
